HISTORY

The Old Stone Dock Association founded its name on the history of the actual Old Stone Dock. This dock, built in 1801, was a stopping place for whaling ships in the early 1800"s. Located at the intersection of Shore Street (then called Ocean Street) and Surf Drive, the Dock was destroyed by a hurricane in 1805. It was rebuilt two years later for the sum of \$8,000.

The Old Stone Dock Improvement Association was formed in 1962 because of concerns of shorefront development. Boards of Directors' meetings were held at the Mooney Estate (the red house at the intersection of Shore Street and Surf Drive).

The Surf Drive – Bywater Court area joined the Association in the 1970's. Expanding the Association, the Mill Road area joined the Association in the 1980's.


